- Organizing a work day to get things done around a military family's home

Families and individuals should consider simple things that make a tangible difference:



- · Offer to mow a family's yard
- Volunteer to do the grocery shopping or babysit
- Listen when a military family member needs to talk



Once you've become active, take it one step further by spreading the word. Inspire teachers, businesspeople and other civic leaders to take action.

For example, a teacher can allow class time for military kids to communicate with deployed loved ones. A business owner, on the other hand, can fund scholarships for military kids to participate in sports teams and other activities.
